- We encourage you to assist your child in choosing an appropriate costume for a school setting. Masks and extra props will not be allowed (no play swords, knives, guns, laser beams, etc.). Please leave all “extra” items at home.
- The wearing of costumes should not create any safety, health, or discipline problems.
