

#### **Steeped in history**

Named after Edward L. Martin, mayor of Kansas City in 1873, Martin City was platted in 1887, destroyed by the tornado of 1957, annexed by Kansas City in 1963, established their renowned St.



Patrick's Day Parade in 1987, and created a Community Improvement District (MC-CID) in 2005.

Martin City has evolved from successful distilling and railroad enterprises by Martin and his partner Arthur Stillwell before the turn of the century to a key economic center in the southwest corner of Kansas City, MO.

#### **Planning for the future**

In 2008 the City of Kansas City Missouri updated the Martin City Area Plan and designated it the plan of record with the city.

This plan allows the Board of Directors of MC-CID to create the vision for the future Martin City that includes existing and new businesses, a walkable

streetscape, colorful graphic signing, gathering spaces and community events.



**Locate your business here** The Martin City CID provides the leadership and vision to create a unique destination area in south Kansas City.

Businesses locating within the CID boundaries can take advantage of the fact that we are designated an **Enhanced Enterprise Zone** and that an **Urban Renewal District** has been established. For qualified businesses, these tools provide assistance in property tax abatement and tax credits.
