Phase 1 Construction: The public bid closes on July 16^{th} ; The contractor will be selected and then 2-3 months wait to get all paperwork in and Council resolution passed. We have met with the KCMO 135^{th} St. Construction Manager, Damon Hodges.

Phase 2 Acquisitions – The AT& T payment has been made; The US Post Office is in the process of accepting our offer.

Phase 3 Acquisitions – Alliance Petroleum property acquisition will need to be addressed once Phase 3 funding is identified (2014). This is the final acquisition for the project.
